A well-deserved thank you goes out to the club members and non-club members who participated on the day of our successful hamfest. The weather could have been better but regardless we had a good turnout between drizzling rain and occasional downpours. The rough headcount of attendees numbered between 100 and 125.

A special thank you goes to the Lynnville Fire Department for allowing us to use their office facility for VE license examinations and for the usage of 8 additional 8 foot tables. Of the 8 we sold 7. We were fortunate again this year to use Diana's Cuts, the local beauty salon next door to the Community Center for overflow parking. Having this extra parking space was very beneficial and will be even more important to free up space for a flea market when the weather cooperates!

This year we provided free coffee, biscuits, gravy and donuts, which seemed to work out well. Certainly something to consider doing again!

Another first was our Raffle, the opportunity to win a Yaesu FTM-400dxr radio, which turned out to be a nice money maker.

ARRL New Online Forums

ARRL's Committee on Communication with ARRL Members has opened new online forums where all radio amateurs — **ARRL members and non-members alike** — can discuss issues and topics in two-way conversation with ARRL leadership. The new groups are aimed at enhancing communication among ARRL leadership, staff, members, and prospective members, in a manner that enables timely updates and collegial discussion.

This project was based on the success over the past several years of the ARRL-LoTW (Logbook of The World) Group in responding to Amateur Radio operators' questions and generating discussion on ways to improve that program. "The LoTW initiative has clearly demonstrated the effectiveness of online Groups as a means of achieving the desired interaction," ARRL said in announcing the new groups.

Visual explanation of SWR and matching

Here is a great [video](#) explaining SWR and impedance matching. The visual representation is great in this old teaching video.

On an elementary conceptual level, this film reflects the multifaceted scientific hyperthinking that was typical of a Bell Labs approach. Dr. J.N. Shive of Bell Labs demonstrates and discusses the following aspects of wave behavior:

Reflection of waves from free and clamped ends
Superposition Standing waves and resonance Energy loss by impedance mismatching
Reduction of energy loss by quarter-wave and tapered-section transformers

The Amateur Radio Emergency Service® (ARES) consists of licensed amateurs who have voluntarily registered their qualifications and equipment, with their local ARES leadership, for communications duty in the public service when disaster strikes. Every licensed amateur, regardless of membership in ARRL or any other local or national organization is eligible to apply for membership in ARES. Training may be required or desired to participate fully in ARES. Please inquire at the local level for specific information. Because ARES is an Amateur Radio program, only licensed radio amateurs are eligible for membership. The possession of emergency-powered equipment is desirable, but is not a requirement for membership.
