

TAPE MEASURE BEAM FOR RADIO DIRECTION FINDING

I didn't design the tape measure beam, but built it from an article by Joe Leggio WB2HOL at

http://theleggios.net/wb2hol/projects/rdf/tape_bm.htm.

I did change a few things since I don't want to make it a permanent feature for my shack.

The 1st change was to not to glue the PVC. This way I could take it apart for storage. The antenna is design for foxhunting on 2 meters, but it will also transmit.

We will need 1/2 inch PVC pipe, two of those four way PVC connectors, and 1 PVC T connector. Once you have the materials cut the pipe to the length in the picture below and assemble. If you want to make it permanent you will also need some PVC glue for these connections.

Using a pair of shears, or an old pair of scissors, cut the tape measure to the given length in the picture below. Be careful not to cut yourself on the cut edges of the tape measure. I use electrical tape on the ends of the cut tape measure to avoid this. Assemble the cut length of tape measure to the PVC framework. I use 1/2 inch hose clamps to attach the cut tape measure lengths to the PVC framework as shown it the picture below.

The matching network uses a "hairpin match". This is made from a 5 inch length of wire that is connected across the feed points of the driven element. The reason for the "hairpin match" is this antenna has some capacitive reactance and the 5 inch length of wire has just enough inductance to cancel the capacitive reactance. Scrape the enamel off of the tape measure to solder the 5 inch hairpin match. You may have to desolder and resolder as you trim the 5 inch wire for the desired SWR.

Once you have all the above done it is time to attach the coax. I use RG58, because of its small size. The coax is connected directly to the driven element. Remember to either sand or scrape the enamel off of the tape measure elements. Do this weather you solder or use another method to connect the coax to the driven element halves.


Note: You may have to adjust the hairpin match or slide the driven elements closer or farther apart. Be patient and you will get it to work.

Note: If you are making this antenna for a 2 meter beam at your QTH you may want to cut some extra PVC pipe for each element and then secure each element either with electrical tape or other method to keep the elements in line and stop them from moving with the wind.

Route 66 On the Air Special Event

The ARRL Letter for September 1, 2022

The annual Route 66 On the Air Special Event will take place September 10 - 18, 2022. The purpose of the event is to commemorate the history of the "Mother Road" connecting the east and west United States.

Now in its 23rd year, the Northern Arizona DX Association (NADXA) started the event, which is now coordinated by the Citrus Belt Amateur Radio Club

(CBARC) in San Bernardino, California.

There will be 21 stations with 1x1 call signs on the air from Chicago, Illinois, to Santa Monica, California, all with consecutive calls starting with W6. NADXA will operate three of the 21 stations, including W6G (Flagstaff, Arizona), and W6S (Arizona Rover 1). They'll set up at various spots along Route 66 east of Flagstaff, and W6T (Arizona Rover 2) will be set up in Bellemont. Later in the week, the event will be moved to Parks, on old Route 66, west of Flagstaff.



The history of the Mother Road began in 1926, when US Highway 66 was established. It was the first major improvement to the link between the west coast and the nation's heartland. Through stories, songs, and TV shows, the highway came to symbolize the freedom of the open road, inspiring many to see America in its entirety. The demise of Route 66 began in the 1950s, as construction began on the new interstate highway system. US Route 66 was officially decommissioned in 1986, but today, small portions of the highway still exist in several states.

All 75 Ohio state parks can be used for the 2022 contest, and the contest period will be from 10 AM to 6 PM ET. OSPOTA was conceived with three main goals in mind: to promote public awareness of amateur radio and Ohio's beautiful state park system, to contribute to the recognition of Ohio's diverse ecology, and to promote camaraderie among the ranks of Ohio's amateur radio operators. Some minor changes to the rules have been made for 2022. Only standard Cabrillo log files will be accepted for entries.
