For those of you who may have never heard of the DXCC Honor Roll, it is a pretty prestigious accomplishment to attain.


[Honor Roll: Attaining the DXCC Honor Roll represents the pinnacle of DX achievement: To qualify, you must have a total confirmed entity count that places you among the numerical top ten DXCC entities total on the current DXCC List (example: if there

are 340 current DXCC entities, you must have at least 331 entities confirmed). Deleted entities do not count towards the DXCC Honor Roll.]
