Remembering the 37 flood.

A clipping from the Evansville Courier.

Ham radio operators helped, too

To the Editor of The Courier:

One aspect of the '37 flood which was omitted in your Jan. 11 coverage was the role of amateur radio in

handling emergency traffic.

Amateur radio station W9YJH was operated by Max Pemberton out of his home on South Elliott Street until he was flooded out and moved by authorities, first to the U.S. Post Office headquarters of the Naval Reserve, and then to a permanent location, Office of the Dean of Girls, Reitz High School, for the duration of the flood emergency. By order of Col. L.L. Roberts, station W9YJH was given exclusive authority to operate on the "160" amateur band and all other amateur stations were prohibited from operating on that band to prevent interference.

Four additional operators were sent to Reitz to assist amateur radio station W9YJH — they were: Darwin "Lefty" Covert, W9KVE; Morty Silverman, W9GZB; Al Schoettlin, W9UMS; and Ed Carpenter, W9OMS. All emergency traffic was handled on around-the-clock shifts, such as, dispatching Coast

telephone input, regular contact with Illinois State Police handling offers for food, water, clothing, bedding, etc., dispatched from hundreds of miles away. Radio station W9YJH also acted as liaison between Evansville police, Indiana State Police, Naval Reserve, Coast Guard and the Red Cross, as necessary.

In one instance, a call was made on an aircraft frequency warning the pilot not to land at Evansville airport, contrary to his instructions, because it was under several inches of water.

Another time, broadcast station WHAS, Louisville, was called to assist in getting the message out to rescue two men who were marooned atop a crane.

The operators lived on ham, eggs and coffee three times a day for several weeks. Some of their experiences were written up in the three Evansville newspapers, and a dinner was given in their honor. In addition, their use of "ham radio" was nationally recognized in amateur radio publications.

My husband, now operator of Amateur Radio Station K4HAX, is still active in amateur radio and serves as net control station three times per week on an intercontinental amateur traffic net on 14.31 megahertz to assist ships at sea and deployed U.S. personnel in third-party traffic, where permitted by international treaty. He also works half-days as city electrical inspector in Henderson.
